

German volunteers teach Nkonya schools

FOR the third year in a row, a group of six students/teacher trainees from the University of Flensburg, Germany, led by Professor Bea Lundt, has visited Nkonya Wurupong as guests of the Nkonyaman Foundation, a local non-governmental organisation (NGO).

This year, the Germans taught Mathematics, Science and English for five weeks at the three Wurupong Basic schools.

On October 12, 2012, their teaching projects, together with the students' work, were presented at the Wurupong Community Centre to be viewed by the pupils, their parents and the general public.

At the same time, the third speech and prize-giving day of the Nkonya Wurupong Basic Schools took place at the Wurupong Community Centre. The Nkonyaman Foundation distributed 72 book prizes to pupils who excelled in subjects in their classes. Also, the best teacher in each school received a special parcel as token of appreciation.

It is the aim of the Nkonyaman Foundation to motivate pupils and teachers to give of their best to improve teaching and learning at the Wurupong Basic Schools.

The foundation is the brainchild of a retired educationist, Dr Fordjor, and his wife, Mrs Ingrid Lipka-Fordjor.

It has engaged in capacity-building activities for teachers of the Wurupong Kindergarten and Basic schools.

Last year, the foundation organised an intensive in-service training for kindergarten teachers at Wurupong. Additionally, a workshop was organised for the teachers of English in the Basic schools.
